Early-mid C19 convex crescent, each house 3 storeys, some with 2 windows, others only 1. Stock brick. Giant stucco pilasters divide houses and support entablature with modillion cornice and blocking course. One building, the Crown Public House, has raised mansard with dormers: others have flat dormers in low pitched slated roofs. Sash windows, some with glazing bars, in moulded architraves. 1st floor windows have cornices and 1 or 2 have pediments. On ground floor modern projecting shop fronts. The Crown Public House has an early C20 ground floor deeply recessed with a glazed bowed centre and fascia above resting on cast iron columns. Over fascia cornice a handsome wrought iron screen with name and symbol. The terrace included partly for its importance on corner site.

Nos 406 to 422 (even) form a group.
