



Free guided history walks

The History of Hackney (Stoke Newington to Dalston) – 4.5km/2.8miles

The walk will cover: Ridley Road anti-fascist clashes; Dalston Market; Newington Green philosophers/dissenters; Coronation Ave Blitz; Jack Hat McVitie (notorious London criminal); Magnificent Seven Cemeteries and a tour of the newly opened Dalston Library/archives.

When: **Thursday 26th April 2012, 10.00 - 13.00**
(tour of library 12.00 -13.00)

The History of Hackney (Springfield to Hackney Museum) – 5km/3.2miles

The walk will cover: Clapton logboat; Lea Valley & nature reserve; biodiversity; canals; waterbeds; Clapton Pond; Sutton House (Built in 1535 by prominent courtier of Henry VIII); St Augustines Tower (Knights Templar), Hackney Empire (Marie Lloyd, music hall legends), Hackney Museum and more.

When: **Wednesday 9 May 2012, 11.00 - 13.00**

The History of Hackney (Hackney Wick Station to Hackney Museum) – 3.2km/2miles

The walk will cover: Industrial Revolution; Victoria Park; St Mary of Eton church; Well Street; Sutton House (Tudor history); St Johns (graveyard & giant church); Clapton Square (green awards and residence of victim of first ever railway murder!); St Augustine's tower (Knights Templar); Hackney Museum and more.
