


Introduction

This profile explores the demographic, social and economic characteristics of Springfield Ward and is largely based on data drawn from the 2011 Census. The ward profiles should be a helpful resource for local people and services that want a basic overview of the key characteristics and make up of local wards.

In 2014 new ward boundaries were introduced in Hackney. This means that it is not possible to directly source data from the 2011 Census for this ward. The Census data contained in this profile for the ward is built up from smaller geographies, and uses a 'best fit' methodology¹. This profile is a snapshot, and is intended to support an understanding of Hackney's ward characteristics and support local decision making.

All data used in this profile has been drawn from the 2011 Census unless otherwise stated. More ward-level statistics can be found at the GLA Datastore <u>Ward Profiles</u> pages. Further research, statistics and intelligence about Hackney can also be found on the <u>Shared Evidence Base</u> pages of the Council's website. These pages contain detailed needs assessments on health, housing, the local economy and child poverty and family wellbeing. Key data is summarized in the quarterly <u>Facts and Figures</u> leaflet.

¹ It should also be noted that there may be some anomalies in the new data due to rounding. Additionally, if ONS do at some point update Census data according to new Ward boundaries, the data that would be released would differ slightly from that in this profile. This is because ONS would re-analyse the Census data to aggregate exactly to new Ward boundaries, rather than use 'best fit' methods.

Key characteristics

Springfield Ward lies on the North East of Hackney. At the time of the 2011 Census it was home to 15,807 people. The ward includes Springfield Park.

Springfield has proportionally more children and young people than Hackney and fewer adults aged 20-44. Springfield has larger proportions of residents from other white ethnic groups and fewer black residents than the borough as a whole. Springfield has higher proportions of Jewish residents and people who decline to state a religion than Hackney overall. There are proportionally more households living in shared ownership and private rented accommodation and fewer social renters in Springfield than Hackney.

Qualification levels in Springfield are lower than the Hackney average, and there are considerably fewer adults working full-time in the ward. Unemployment in Springfield is higher than for Hackney as a whole.

Springfield residents experience somewhat better health than the Hackney norm.

Hackney has a greater proportion of children under seven years than London or England and Wales, around the same proportion of children 8-15, and fewer young people aged 15-19.

It has a particularly large cohort of 20-44 year olds, and fewer people aged 45 and over.

Springfield has a greater proportion of children and young adults under 20, but fewer adults aged 20 – 44.

Hackney is one of the most ethnically diverse boroughs in the country – just over 40% of its residents are non-white.

Black groups make up the largest component of the minority communities, accounting for almost a quarter of Hackney's residents, followed by the white other group, which can include east and west Europeans, north and south Americans, white Africans and Antipodeans.

There are proportionately more residents from other white backgrounds and fewer black residents in Springfield than the Hackney average.

Less than half of Hackney's residents describe themselves as Christians – a significantly smaller proportion than in London or England. The borough has relatively high proportions of people of the Jewish and Muslim faiths and people with no religion or who declined to state one.

Springfield has proportionately fewer Christians, but more Jewish residents and those who did not state a religion than the rest of Hackney.

Hackney has proportionately more lone parent, single person and multi person households than the averages for both London and England, and fewer married couple households (both with and without children).

Springfield has proportionally more married couples with children and fewer 'other' multi person households than the Hackney average.

Nearly half of Hackney's housing is socially rented, a much higher percentage than in London or nationally. Home ownership is correspondingly lower – less than a quarter of the borough's households are owner occupiers. Nearly a third of Hackney's households rent their homes from a private landlord.

Springfield has proportionally more private renters and households in shared ownership, but fewer social renters than Hackney overall.

London's qualifications profile tends to differ from the national picture. It has a better-educated population, with 37.7% of people having at least a first degree (level 4/5). It also has below average rates of residents with level 1 or 2 qualifications (to GCSE level), and lower rates of residents with no qualifications, too.

These trends are even more pronounced in Hackney. Over 40% of residents have degree-level qualifications. The proportion with no qualifications in Hackney is higher than the London average, but lower than the England average. Hackney has relatively few adults with mid-level qualifications.

Springfield has a considerably greater proportion of people with no qualifications and fewer with degree-level qualifications and above than Hackney as a whole.

Economic activity rates in Hackney are now about the same as in London or England.

The full-time employment rate in Springfield is lower than the Hackney average. There are also a greater proportion of students, retired people and adults looking after the home and family in Springfield than the Hackney average. Unemployment in Springfield is also higher than in Hackney overall.

London's profile is strongly skewed towards managerial, professional and administrative occupations with smaller proportions than nationally of skilled tradespeople; process plant and machine operatives; and those in personal or customer service occupations.

Hackney differs somewhat from the London pattern. It has more professionals and associates and fewer managers. It also has a slightly higher percentage of those in elementary occupations.

In Springfield there are proportionately fewer professionals and associate professionals and more administrators, skilled trades, and people employed in sales, service and manufacturing industries and elementary occupations than the Hackney average.



The health of Hackney's residents is broadly in line with national trends. It should be noted though that the borough has a young population by England standards.

Residents of Springfield Ward experience somewhat better health than the average in Hackney, London and England.

A slightly lower proportion of people living in Springfield Ward report having a long-term limiting illness or disability than in Hackney overall.

The proportion of residents providing unpaid care in Springfield is slightly higher than the Hackney average.

Deprivation


Index of Multiple Deprivation gauges the level of deprivation in a locality across several 'domains', including employment, income, health, education and crime.

England is divided into over 32,000 Lower Super Output Areas (LSOA's). These are areas containing around 1,500 people and 650 households.

Since the 2014 ward boundary changes Lower Super Output Areas no longer match ward boundaries exactly. The map opposite illustrates the parts of the ward which experience the greatest deprivation. The areas shaded in red and dark orange lie in the 20% most deprived Lower Super Output Areas in England and the light orange and yellow areas are in the 30% most deprived LSOA's and above.

Southern and central areas of Springfield Ward tend to experience higher levels of deprivation.

According to a calculation prepared by the Local Government Association, Springfield ranks 10th out of 21 wards in Hackney in terms of deprivation. It is within the 15% most deprived wards in London, ranking 90 out of 654 wards, and is within the 15% most deprived English wards.²

Springfield Ward is part of the Hackney North and Stoke Newington constituency. This was won in 2015 by Dianne Abbott (Labour) with a majority of 18,350, winning 62.9% of the votes cast on a 56.8% turn out for the constituency
