Zone C

Your Controlled Parking Zone is changing. Summary results of Zone C (Dalston) Public Consultation

Why have I received this booklet?

This leaflet provides a summary of the changes to your Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) that will happen as a result of the recent Zone C review.

These reviews are designed to help us make sure that each CPZ meets the needs of the local communities they serve. We aim to review every new CPZ after its first year of operation and then again every three years thereafter, as outlined in the Council's Parking and Enforcement Plan (2005).

Consultation Responses

The public consultation for this review took place over 10 weeks from 6 November 2006 to 12 January 2007. The majority of feedback came in the form of completed questionnaires, but we also received comments through letters, telephone calls, door-to-door surveys and our public drop-in sessions. Overall, we received 265 responses.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who took part in the consultation. Your feedback has played a vital part in developing the changes that are going to be made in your area. Your comments about customer satisfaction are also very important and will help us shape how we deliver our services in the future. With limited amount of kerb side space and competing demands for the available spaces, every effort has been made to balance the needs of all service users.

Consultation responses indicate that most people are able to park locally with ease, although difficulty increases with proximity to the A10 'red route' – this road has minimal parking provision despite passing through busy commercial areas. However, many businesses have indicated that there are insufficient spaces for both themselves and their visitors.

Major design changes to your CPZ

As result of your feedback, we have considered changes to the general design, operational hours, and pay and display charging structure of your CPZ.

- A reallocation of parking bays to reflect how they are used, so that more spaces are available to residents, short-term visitors and businesses where they are needed.
- Improved pay and display charging structure to encourage shorter parking times in commercial areas so that more short-stay visitors can use the spaces.

Operational hours

- The most popular start and finish times were the same as those that are currently in operation. The operational hours for Zone C will therefore remain Monday to Saturday, 7:00am - 7:00pm.

Improving the CPZ for residents

- We are installing double yellow lines ('no waiting at any time' restrictions) across private access points to ensure that they can be kept clear at all times.
- We are creating new bays to increase parking provision; the new resident permit bays on Sandringham Road will make more spaces available to local residents.
- We are reallocating some existing bays to ensure the different types of parking provision are located where they are needed; some shared use and pay and display bays on Downs Park Road, Queensbridge Road, Ramsgate Street, Ritson Road, Sandringham Road, and Tyssen Street will become resident permit only, effectively increasing spaces available to residents in the area.

Improving the CPZ for local businesses...

- We are creating new bays to increase parking provision; the new permit bay on John Campbell Road will make more spaces available to local permit holders, while new shared use bays on Arcola Street, Bradbury Street, and Trumans Road will benefit short-stay visitors also.
- We are reallocating some existing bays to ensure the different types of parking provision are located where they are needed; the alteration of a pay and display bay on Shacklewell Lane to a permit use bay and a resident permit bay on Roseberry Place to shared use will create more spaces for local permit holders. We are also changing a shared use bay on Sandringham Road to pay and display only, which will reserve more spaces for short-stay visitors.

Ridley Road Market

- Following consultation with local market traders we will be installing double yellow lines throughout the Ridley Road Market. This will allow traders provision to load and unload in the area but then vacate and use alternative parking arrangements.
- This change will keep the market area free of parked vehicles and will increase safety for pedestrians.



Improved Pay and Display tariff structure

We have improved the pay and display charging structure to encourage shorter parking times in commercial areas so that more short-stay customers parking can use these spaces.

Making the roads safer

We will be making some design changes to improve the safety of your CPZ, these include:

- Installing double yellow lines ('no waiting at any time' restrictions) at most junctions to make sure that visibility for pedestrians, cyclists and drivers is preserved.
- Installing double yellow lines along some sections of road where the minimum running width needs to be maintained for emergency vehicle access.
- Installing double yellow lines in heavily congested areas and on some priority bus routes to ease obstructions and keep traffic flowing.



Key Implementation Dates

Subject to weather conditions, we plan to:

- Start the sign and lining works in February 2008.
- Commence enforcement of the new changes on March 2008.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

How do my views influence the design of the CPZ?

Public feedback helps us identify the needs and preferences of all service users so that we can develop a balanced CPZ with parking space allocated accordingly. Although limited by a finite amount of kerb space, we aim to meet demand by reallocating bays and installing new bays where possible. This is why it is so important that you provide us with your feedback during reviews.

Do you consider road safety?

We work closely with the Emergency Services and the Traffic and Highways Departments to determine safety considerations for your CPZ. We plan to install double yellow lines ('no waiting at any time' restrictions) at most junctions to improve road safety for both pedestrians and motorists. In some cases, we might shorten or remove bays if they obstruct traffic flow in your CPZ. This safety design principle has been applied to Shacklewell Lane and Sandringham Road.

Will we be notified before the changes come into effect?

The Council will notify all affected residents and businesses well in advance of making any changes to parking bays. You can see our planned date for starting works on page 5 of this leaflet. A reminder letter explaining the pending changes and detailing our implementation timetable will be sent to you nearer the time.

Do you monitor if the CPZ changes are effective?

We carry out an interim review of the CPZ once every three years. We also welcome feedback about the changes at anytime.

Differential Parking Charges

As of 1 July 2007 all London Borough Councils made the levels of Penalty Charge Notices (PCNs) more proportional to the contravention.

This fairer system of parking enforcement is intended to reflect the difference between contraventions with a more serious impact on road safety (such as parking on double yellow lines) and those which do not pose a potential danger to the public (such as parking after the expiry of a pay and display ticket).

New 'greener' permit prices

Parking permits are now priced according to the size of your vehicle's engine and the fuel it uses. These factors relate to the volume of gases emitted by your vehicle that have an impact on the local and global environment.

If your car has an engine which is more environmentally friendly (under 1200cc) or partly runs on greener fuel then it will be eligible for a 50% discount on the standard price of a parking permit. If you own an electric car or another vehicle that runs solely on greener fuel you can apply for a **FREE** permit.

Your annual residents parking permit will be priced accordingly:

Engine Size/ Fuel Type	Against normal permit	Permit Price (Annual cost)
Electric Vehicle, 100% LPG or CNG	-100%	Free
Small engine under 1200 dual fuel or hybrid	-50%	£41.50
Normal size 1200 to 2000	Normal (N/A)	£83
Large engine 2001 to 3000	+50%	£124.50
Larger 3001 to 4000	+100%	£166
Largest 4001 plus	+150%	£207.50

Cessation of clamping

The clamping and removal policies have been revised as of 1 July 2007. In most instances we will cease to clamp, or remove, your vehicle if you are parked in an authorised parking space. However there will be number of exceptions such as:

- Parking in a disabled bay without a valid Blue or Companion Badge.
- Footway parking (dropped kerbs and pavements)
- Parking on single or double yellow lines during set hours
- Where the parked vehicle is obstructing traffic
- Persistent evaders of parking fines
