

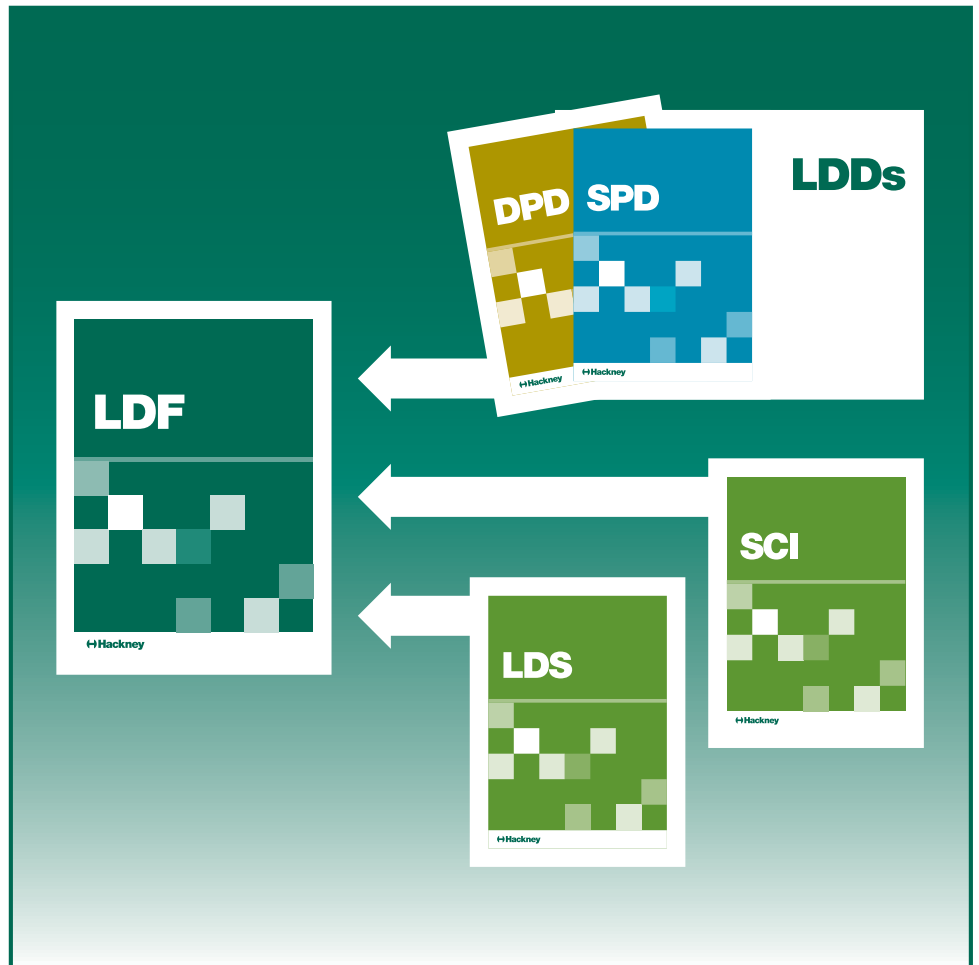

Hackney LDF Update – 28 Feb 2005

### Local Development Scheme

Following approval by Cabinet on 20 September 2004, minor changes have been made to the Local Development Scheme (LDS) to incorporate Government Office for London (GOL) comments on presentation. In particular the revised LDS features details on each development plan document, and a user friendly introduction. We will check the revisions with GOL and submit the final draft for their approval by the end of February. Once approved the LDS will be published for public reference.

## Core Strategy

A draft Core Strategy is at the early stages of development. We are currently incorporating findings from evidence based studies and workshops conducted with other Council functions such as transport and economic development. Hackney's Community Strategy themes also drive the strategy. We plan to put the draft Core Strategy to Cabinet on 29 March. Once approved we will consult with key stakeholders and the public on the draft Core Strategy

## Dalston Area Action Plan

Its rich cultural diversity, vibrant Ridley Road market and extensive retail activity make Dalston Hackney's only major centre as defined by the London Plan. With the introduction of the East London Line the area is set to play an important transport role in future years. We are in the preliminary stages of developing the Dalston Area Action Plan (AAP). Through an extensive consultation programme the public and key stakeholders will have the opportunity to contribute to this planning document. Based on current schedules, community workshops will be held in early

summer and late 2005, with the final AAP being completed by 2006.

## Hackney Central Area Action Plan

Hackney Central is identified as a district centre within the London Plan. It has an important business and commercial function within the borough. The area of Mare Street around the Town Hall and the Hackney Empire also forms a vital cultural quarter for the local area. We are currently establishing the programme for the Hackney Central Area Action Plan (AAP). It will include extensive consultation with key stakeholders and the wider community.

## Live Work Supplementary Planning Document

In December 2004, we commissioned a review of the Council's live work policy. This study includes an extensive survey of live work projects, and recommends options regarding the management of live work for the Council to consider and develop.
